EXTRACT COPY OF RESOLUTION PASSED BY DIU MUNICIPAL COUNCIL IN THEIR SPECIAL MEETING HELD ON 15-09-2022 AT 11.00 A.M. IN THE COUNCIL HALL.

## OTHER POINTS RAISED IN THE MEETING FROM THE CHAIR.

## 1. DISCUSSION REGARDING IMPLEMENTATION OF SANITATION USER CHARGES FROM HOTELS, SHOPS, BANKS, GOVERNMENT OFFICES, AND OTHER COMMERCIAL ESTABLISHMENTS UNDER DIU MUNICIPAL COUNCIL SOLID WASTE MANAGEMENT BYE LAWS 2018.

The Chief Officer started the discussion by informing the President and all the Councillors about the Diu Municipal Solid Waste (Management and handling) Bye Laws 2018 and Sanitation User charges that is to be collected form the general public towards door to door collection of garbage from the households, hotels, shops, Govt. offices, banks etc as per the aforementioned Bye Laws. The Chief Officer briefed about the Sanitation charges as per Bye Law that shall be applicable for different categories. Currently, the work of door to door collection, segregation and processing of Waste from DMC area is handed to Green SWM Infra Pvt. Ltd. Therefore, it is necessary to collect Sanitation User Charges from the general public and commercial establishments in DMC area. The Sanitation User Charges as per the above mentioned Bye Laws is shown in the table below:

The President apprised that the Council shall not implement the Sanitation User Charges from the residential house initially, however, the Sanitation User Charges shall be collected from hotels, shops, banks, government offices, and other commercial establishments in the first stage. All the councillors agreed with the suggestion of the President and decided that the Sanitation User Charges shall not be implemented from residential houses in first stage.

Further, Shri Dinesh Sakar Kapadia, Councillor suggested that the Council may increase the rates for the Hotels and Restaurants as the waste produced by them is in bulk. The following increased rates were decided by the Council in the meeting:

In this regard, the Chief Officer informed that we may submit the proposal to the Director of Municipal Administration, DNH & DD for approval of new increased rates as mentioned in the Bye Laws. This procedure shall take time for approval and the same may be implemented form next financial year, if approved by the Director of Municipal Administration, DNH & DD. Meanwhile, the Chief Officer suggested that we may increase the rates at 5% per year as per rules w.e.f. the financial year 2018-19 when the Bye Laws were published in the Official Gazette of U.T. Administration. Therefore, the rates for the current year 2022-23 will be as shown in table below:

After detailed discussion, the Council unanimously resolved that Sanitation User Charges shall be collected as per the rates shown at Table C from hotels, shops, banks, government offices, and other commercial establishments in the first stage and the same may be implemented for residential houses afterwards. Also, Diu Municipal Council shall send a proposal to Director of Municipal Administration, DNH & DD for increasing the Sanitation User charges as shown in the Table B.
